## Arrival/Dismissal

- Upon arrival students will enter through the main building and report to breakfast and/or spill-out. Students will not be permitted to go to any classroom until 8:25 a.m.

- Excused absences include:

  - Medical appointment

  - Observance of a religious holiday or service when it is mandated for all members of a faith that such holiday or service be observed.

### **Attendance Counts**

- If a student must be absent, upon returning to school he/she must:
  - Bring their excuse notes to school with three (3) days of the absence.
- Place your notes in the "Drop Box" at the Security Desk at the front entrance of the school. Notes must have student names and ID# clearly written on them.
- Students must initiate the request for make-up work. All work must be completed within the timeframe in which the teacher has advised. **Make-up assignments is ONLY given for excused absences only.**
- Shenandoah utilizes block scheduling resulting in three (3) double blocked class periods a day. Any absences from any class can affect your grade due to the amount of material covered in one class period.

### Things to Know about Attendance

- After 10 absences you are considered at risk for Truancy
  - At 15 absences students are Truant and will be placed on a contract.
- Make-Up work isn't provided to students with unexcused absences.
- Students that live outside of the school feeder area with excessive absences will be at risk to be returned to their homeschool.
- Vacations are not considered an excused absence.


